COMPARISON OF FACTORS

The People have attempted to gather information for the court to assist it in making a decision that will be in the "interest of justice." To accomplish this task, due to the lack of time, the People have made use of the internet and many travel search tools.

A. Population of Counties

According to the most recent figures available (included in prior filings), Alameda County has a population of 1,496,200 residents, and ranks 7th in the State. Orange County has a population of 2,978,800 residents and ranks 2nd in the State. San Mateo has a population of 717,000 residents and ranks 13th in the State. Santa Clara County has a population of 1,729,900 residents and ranks 5th in the State.

B. Airport Accessibility

Oakland International Airport is approximately 3 miles from downtown Oakland. It is served by the following airlines:
Alaska, American, Aloha, AmericaWest, Continental, Delta, Horizon, Mexicana, JetBlue, Southwest and United. It is served by the following car rental companies: Avis, Budget, Dollar, Enterprise, Fox, Hertz, National and Thrifty.

Orange County John Wayne Airport is approximately 10 miles from downtown Santa Ana. It is served by the following airlines:

Alaska, Aloha, American, AmericaWest, Continental, Delta, Frontier,

Midwest, Northwest, Southwest and United. It is served by the following car rental companies: Alamo, Avis, Budget, Enterprise,

Hertz, National and Thrifty.

San Francisco International Airport is is approximately 10 miles from downtown San Mateo and approximately 18 miles from downtown Redwood City. It is served by ALL major (and many minor) airlines and car rental companies.

The San Jose International Airport is located approximately 5 miles from the Santa Clara Hall of Justice in downtown Santa Clara. The airport provides services for major airlines including Alaska, Air Canada, American, Canadian Air, Mexicana Airlines, Skywest, Southwest, United, America West, Continental, Northwest, TWA and Delta. There are several rental car companies serving the airport area including, Able, Avis, Dollar, Alamo, Hertz, Thrifty and National. There are also free shuttle bus services connecting to the public transportation system.

C. Public Transportation

Alameda has ground transportation including bus (AC Transit). There is an AirTrain link to the Amtrak station in Jack London Square. The bus service connects with Amtrak and BART (the nearest BART station is the Coliseum/Airport station).

Orange County has ground transportation including light rail and bus. The bus/light rail service connects with Amtrak, Greyhound, and MetroLink terminals approximately 10 miles away.

In San Mateo there is also ground transportation including bus connections to CalTrain and BART. (CalTrain is commuter service from San Francisco, the nearest BART station is at the airport).

For Santa Clara, the Valley Transportation Authority operates a

bus and light rail system throughout the Santa Clara/San Jose area. Several bus routes are close to hotels and the courthouse. The bus service also connects with Amtrak, Caltrain, ACE, and BART. (ACE is a commuter service from Stockton). The closest BART station is located in Fremont. The Amtrak Station is approximately 12 blocks from the courthouse.

D. Distance and Travel Costs

The distance from the Stanislaus County Courthouse to the Wiley Manuel Courthouse in Alameda, located at 661 Washington Street,
Oakland, CA 94607, is 81 miles, with an estimated travel time of 1 hours and 39 minutes, without traffic. (www.MapsOnUs.com.)

The distance from the Stanislaus County Courthouse to the Orange County Central Justice Center (CJC) Courthouse, located at 700 Civic Center Drive, West, Santa Ana, CA 92701, is 339.8 miles, with an estimated travel time of 7 hours and 2 minutes. (Ibid.)

The distance from the Stanislaus County Courthouse to the San Mateo County Courthouse, Southern Branch located at 400 County Center, Redwood City, California, 94063, is 88.4 miles, with an estimated travel time of 1 hours and 56 minutes, without traffic. (Ibid.)

The distance from the Stanislaus County Courthouse to the Santa Clara Hall of Justice Courthouse, located at 190-200 West Hedding Street, San Jose, CA 95110, is 87.2 miles, with an estimated travel time of 1 hours and 45 minutes, without traffic. (Ibid.)

The People anticipate calling several out-of-state witnesses.

Airfares from these out-of-state locations to all of the Bay Area

airports appear to be essentially the same cost, varying in only negligible amounts. This is not the case with Orange County.

The People would also have to fly almost all of our witnesses to Orange County, because of the extremely long drive from Stanislaus County. There are also no direct flights from Modesto to Orange County. The average range of cost for a round-trip to Orange County is \$194-\$550, with some flights from Modesto costing over \$1100. The cheaper fairs are based on witnesses somehow getting themselves to either Sacramento or Bay Area airports - doing this most likely would mean that a county employee would have to drive the witness(es) to the airport, or the witnesses, if able, would have to drive themselves and be reimbursed for milage and parking; the People have several hundred witnesses on the witness list and even if we only called 50% (roughly 175 witnesses) the cost would between \$33,950.00 to \$96,250.00, not including the driving expense.

In this day and age, none of the witnesses can just "hop" on a plane and travel. Each witness is going to have to be at the airport approximately two hours prior to any flight. The reality of this is that each and every witness (not within driving distance to the new courthouse) will be forced to spend the night - either to arrive early enough or because they were there so long. Even if witnesses can fly home after court, the People would again have to pay overtime for a driver, or a rental car or even milage/parking.

E. Hotel Accommodations

In Alameda County, the average rate for one night's hotel is \$150 (per CSAA). Rates do not include taxes and surcharges. Rates

may be negotiable for long term stays.

In Orange County, the average rate for one night's hotel is \$100 (per CSAA). It should be noted that this includes Anaheim and all the inexpensive family motels around theme parks, and which are some distance from the courthouse. Rates do not include taxes and surcharges. Rates may be negotiable for long term stays.

In San Mateo, the average rate for one night's hotel is \$160 (per CSAA). Rates do not include taxes and surcharges. Rates may be negotiable for long term stays.

In Santa Clara, the average nightly rate (CSAA) for a hotel room is \$163.00.

F. Rental Car Rates

For a compact car, the rates range from \$14.24 to \$56.99. The rates varied by county and companies but none significantly.

G. Housing Costs For Staff

For longer-term accommodations, the People obtained rates for extended-stay hotels and apartments off of the internet:

Alameda - Extended-stay hotels ranged from \$49.99- \$169.00 per day, and some security concerns have been raised regarding the "cheaper" locations. Apartments in the Oakland/Alameda/Emeryville area range from approximately \$1,000 to \$1,800 for a one-bedroom facility. Utilities, etc., are not included.

Orange - Extended-stay hotels ranged from \$67-\$159 per day.

Apartments in the Orange County area range from approximately \$800 to \$1,200 for a one-bedroom facility. Utilities, etc., are not

included.

San Mateo - Extended-stay hotels ranged from \$73.99 -\$164 per day. Apartments in the San Mateo area range from \$1000-\$1800 for a one-bedroom facility. Utilities, etc., are not included.

Santa Clara - Extended-stay hotels ranged from \$47.99-\$152 per day. Apartments in the San Jose/Santa Clara area range from approximately \$1,000 to \$1,800 for a one-bedroom facility. Utilities, etc., are not included.

H. Newspaper Coverage

In assessing the quantity of coverage of this case, the People have run internet searches on the name "Scott Peterson" and have found the following (Exhibit 1):

The Alameda County papers Alameda Times Star (www.timesstar.com) published 167 articles using the "all years" feature on the sites search engine and not all of the articles appear to be about this case; the Oakland Tribune (www.oaklandtribune.com) published 136 articles using the "all years" search function and not all of the articles dealt with this case; the San Francisco Chronicle (www.sfgate.com/chronicle) published 133 articles in 2004, 1205 in 2003 and 1180 in 2002 - most of these articles appear not to relate to this case; the San Francisco Examiner (www.sfexaminer.com) published 19 articles from 1/1/2003 to 1/15/2004 using the search engine and not all of these articles relate to this case.

The Orange County papers, the Orange County Register

(www.ocregister.com) published 200 articles using the "all years"

search function but not all of the articles relate to this case, and

the LA Times (<u>www.latimes.com</u>) which has an Orange County edition, published 35 articles (found in the current search area) and 1573 articles (found in the archives) using the "all dates" search but not all of the articles relate to this case.

The San Mateo county papers, the San Mateo County Times

(www.sanmateocountytimes.com) published 87 articles using the "all years" search function but not all of the articles related to this case; and the San Mateo Daily Journal (www.smdailyjournal.org)

published 13 articles using the "search function" and all appear to be related to this case.

The Santa Clara paper, San Jose Mercury News

(www.mercurynews.com) published 150 articles during the period of

12/24/02 to 12/31/03, which dates are limited by the website

archives for the paper. Not all of the articles concerned this case.

I. Television Coverage

Television coverage was previously addressed in both the defense venue motion and the People's Opposition.

CONCLUSION

If the court does not reconsider Sacramento, then it is clear from the above facts that the three Bay Area counties are more appropriate than Orange County; as the Cooper court said:

The court properly considered relative nearness as a factor weighing heavily in favor of trial in San Diego. San Diego was more convenient for witnesses, attorneys, and others, including interested citizens of San Bernardino County, the county of the crime.

People v. Cooper, supra, 53 Cal.3d 771, 805.

If the People had to choose between the Bay Area counties, based on the information provided by the AOC, the People would first select Santa Clara, then San Mateo, and Alameda last. San Mateo has had the least amount of media coverage. Alameda and Orange seem to have had the most media coverage.

The court should also eliminate Orange County as being "cost prohibitive" and posing an undue hardship to witnesses and citizens of Stanislaus County.
