To date, over 23,700 20 pages of documents, 18 videotapes, 100 audio tapes, 5 DVD's, 3 21 wiretap CDs, all search warrant material, and all wiretap 22 documentary evidence has been provided. 23 The People anticipate significant additional discovery will 24 be generated. Said discovery will be provided to the defense as 25 soon as it is received. The People note that additional 26 discovery is common during the pendency of complex litigation and

reciprocal discovery pursuant to Penal Code Section 1054.3. Specifically, the People request; any real evidence that the defendant intends to offer at trial, the names and addresses of persons, other than the defendant, he intends to call as witnesses at trial, together with any relevant written or recorded statements of those persons, including any reports or statements of those persons, including any reports or statements of experts made in connection with the case, and including the results of physical or mental examinations, scientific tests, experiments, or comparisons which the defendant intends to offer in evidence at the trial.

The People also intend said request to apply to any evidence the defense intends to introduce at the preliminary hearing.

In response to the latest defense discovery request the People will respond in numerical order corresponding to the defense numbers 1-26.

- 1. Names of People's witnesses: Already provided in the discovered material. The People will provide a witness list to the defense naming all witnesses the People intend to call at the preliminary hearing no later than 9-02-03. The People reserve the right to update the list after that date. The People expect that a preliminary hearing witness list will be provided by the defense at the same time.
- 2. Statements of all defendants: Already provided. The People note that the defendant made numerous statements to media personnel during the investigation of these murders. The People know that the defense is fully aware of said material. However,

- 3. All relevant real evidence seized: Already provided. The People have provided all relevant photographic evidence, audio recordings, video recordings, all physical evidence not subject to scientific processing, or where scientific processing is complete, said evidence has been made available to the defense for viewing. Other items will be made available for viewing as scientific processing is completed. Due to the large volume of physical evidence in existence, said evidence will be made available for viewing upon notice from the defense of the exact item that is to be viewed.
- 4. Existence of felony/misdemeanor convictions: None known.
- 5. Written statements of witnesses, including expert reports: Already provided. 308 pages of reports/notes have already been provided from the Department of Justice laboratory. However, the People have requested and will shortly receive, additional notes/reports from the Department of Justice. Said reports will be turned over as soon as they are received.
 - 6. Exculpatory evidence: None known.
- 7. Victim personal or emotional involvement with the District Attorney's Office: None known.
 - 8. Preliminary drafts of forensic reports: See (5).
- 9. Police officer's notes extant May 27, 2003: Either have already been provided, or will be provided when received.

- 10. [Wiretap] attorney communication sheets. None known by the People.
 - 11. [Wiretap] summary call logs: Already provided.
 - 12. [Wiretap] all log entries: Same as 11.
 - 13. Refused applications for search warrants: None known.
 - 14. All wiretap information: Already provided.
- 15. All subpoenas: All law enforcement subpoenas already provided.
- 16. Hypnotized witnesses: Kristen Deppenwolf. Cognitive interview where hypnosis techniques were used.
 - 17. Exhibits A-F of Jacobson reports: Already provided.
- 18. Names of tracking dogs used in case: Already provided. Veterinary records of tracking dogs: The People do not have this information in their possession. The People will serve a subpoena for said information. If said information is not provided in response to the subpoena the People will not make further efforts to obtain said information.
- 19. Training information regarding tracking dogs: The People do not have this information in their possession. The People have requested whatever information is available and will discover whatever information is received. The People will not ask for training information not already contained in law enforcement possession. The "CARDA" records have previously been subpoenaed and are in the court's possession. All previous training videotapes of the tracking dogs will not be requested. Any videotape of the tracking procedure used in this case has
